MAYOR'S CORNER

NEW NORTH BENCH FIRE STATION

Public safety is a top priority for Lehi City, and as the city continues to grow, the need to increase facilities and services becomes important. After careful consideration and study, it was determined to build the second of five stations envisioned in Lehi City, located at approximately 256 W 2600 N. to better service citizens to the north.

The fire station will house a 5 man crew, with 24 hours a day, 7 days a week coverage. Both fire and ambulance service will be provided. Ambulance service will be at the paramedic level which is the highest level of medical care offered for emergency medical response. The noise policy will include quiet hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. Fire Department personnel will not use sirens during these hours unless there is a traffic issue requiring immediate response. Efforts will be made to offer public education classes related to fire safety, basic first aid, CPR and emergency preparedness at the fire station for families, schools, pre-school classes, scout groups and other civic clubs. Public tours through the fire station will be scheduled for local residents.

We hope this new facility can bring an added comfort and safety to nearby neighborhoods and families as we continue to provide the best service possible to residents. We also look forward to building an additional three stations in the future to help achieve our goal of 5 minute response to all in the community. LEHI CITY POWER

Lehi City Power's mission is to supply reliable, low-cost electricity. Despite all the careful planning and work by Lehi City Power we occasionally experience power outages, sometimes due to circumstance beyond our control (i.e. weather, cars running into utility poles, etc.) Lehi City Power has a carefully planned outage restoration plan and encourages you to also plan for the unexpected. Here are a few tips to help you establish your own emergency plan for your family.

Before a Power Outage:

- Learn the location of your fuse box or circuit breaker.
 - Store candles, flashlights, battery-operated lanterns with extra batteries, and a radio with extra batteries or a crank radio.

- Have food and water supplies on hand.
- Know the locations of any camping equipment you may have: stove, lantern, sleeping bags, etc. Make sure your equipment is operational and that you know how to use it. Only use the following outside: equipment requiring gasoline, propane, white fuel, Coleman fuel or charcoal briquettes.
- Keep your refrigerator defrosted.
- Have at least one phone in your home that doesn't need to be plugged in to a power outlet.
- Consider locating backup power supplies for critical health equipment.
- Plan to have personal medications on hand.

During a Power Outage:

- Check your fuse or circuit breakers.
- Check to see if your neighbors' power is off to determine if the problem is related only to your home or if the outage extends deeper into your neighborhood.
- Call Lehi City Power at 768-4833 (Monday-Thursday, 7 a.m.- 6 p.m.) or 376-0681 (After Hours).
- Report anything that you have seen or heard that might be helpful such as a broken pole, a tree on a line, or any booms or flashed of light.
- Unplug all your appliances. The surge of power that comes when power is restored could ruin appliances.
- Turn off all but one or two light switches so you will know when your service is back on.
- Open the refrigerator door only to take food out and close it as quickly as possible. A refrigerator or freezer will maintain foods for up to 12 to 28 hours or longer, depending on the room temperature and frequency of opening.
- Use camping equipment outside, six feet away from everything. Use only a fireplace, properly installed wood stove or a new style kerosene heater in a safe area with fresh outside air coming into the area.
- Do not allow children to carry lanterns, candles or fuel.

After the Power Outage:

- When power is restored, plug in appliances one by one, waiting a few minutes between each one. This will prevent overloading the system.
- Your patience is appreciated. Lehi City Power will repair major electric lines which serve hundreds of customers before they can repair scattered

outages. Emergency services, major communication facilities, and customers on life support equipment will also have priority.

- Examine your frozen food. If it still contains ice crystals, it may be refrozen. If meat is off-color or has an odd odor, throw it away.
