

Lehi City Train Quite Zone Facts



In Lehi City, the main railroad line runs in a north-south direction. Freight shipping is conducted primarily by Union Pacific and Utah Railway while passenger

trains are operated by Amtrak and the Utah Transit Authority (UTA), which operates its FrontRunner service alongside Union Pacific's mainline tracks.

Train Horns & Quiet Zones

The Federal Government sets safety and other regulations for railroad operations. These regulations are recorded in CFR Title 49 Transportation. A major safety feature of trains is the train horn. According to CFR Title 49 Part 222, when a train is approaching a crossing (approaching a street): it must sound its horn unless that crossing has been constructed as part of a quiet zone. While a quiet zone can significantly reduce the number of train horns sounded at street crossings, the term "quiet zone" can be misleading because there are several exceptions where engineers may sound their horns in a quiet zone. These exceptions can occur relatively frequently. A horn may be sounded to provide warning to animals, vehicle operators, pedestrians, trespassers or crews on other trains in an emergency situation when an engineer believes such action is appropriate in order to prevent injury, death, or property damage. Additionally, horns may be sounded in conjunction with rail yard operations, off-line industry operations, and signaling device malfunction. Therefore, if you live or work near a quiet zone, you will likely continue to hear horns from trains in that zone. However, the number of horns sounded at street crossings should be significantly reduced from the frequency experienced prior to the quiet zone's establishment.

How Many Train Horns Can I Expect to Hear?

Lehi City's train quiet zone was recently established at around the same time FrontRunner passenger trains began operating. So, while there was a significant decrease in the number of horns being sounded at quiet zone crossings, the number of trains using these routes tripled due to the introduction of frequent UTA FrontRunner commuter trains, thereby increasing the possibility that horns would be sounded. You can expect horns to sound if there is an emergency situation such as people on or dangerously near the tracks.


