LEHI NEARS THE TOP OF THE LIST IN NEW RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

City Ranks Second in Residential Units Built in 4th Quarter of 2012

Lehi, Utah | March 27, 2013 – Lehi City’s fast growth does not appear to be slowing down any time soon. According to a new quarterly report issued by *Construction Monitor*, Lehi ranked second along the Wasatch Front for the number of new residential units built during the 4th quarter of 2012. According to the report, 1,021 new residential units were built in Lehi, which includes new single family homes as well as apartments and condominiums.

Lehi trailed only Salt Lake City, which saw 1,099 new residential units built during the same period. According to the report, most of Lehi’s growth was seen in single family homes, while the majority of the growth in Salt Lake City was the result of new apartments and condominiums.

Derek Todd, Lehi’s City Administrator, is enthusiastic about the

report. “This report is further evidence that Lehi is becoming a major epicenter of economic activity,” said Todd. Todd added, “Lehi’s growth is not only good news for our community, but it is also beneficial for the entire state.” Todd also re-emphasized Lehi’s commitment to facilitating and supporting the new growth that is still to come.

One of the areas that have seen fast growth is the Traverse Mountain area, which has capitalized on the Adobe expansion and the upcoming Xactware location, along with retail development like Cabela’s and the Outlets at Traverse Mountain. Lehi is working hard to build on this exciting new growth.
