LEHI CITY TO HOST 2300 WEST GRAND OPENING

Major Connector Street to Open After Years of Work

Lehi, Utah | August 8, 2013 – After years of work, 2300 West in Lehi will finally be opened on Friday, August 9th. The project first began in 1980, and to celebrate the hard work of all of those involved and the significance of the project, the City is hosting a grand opening celebration for all Lehi residents.



2300 West is a significant road due to its ability to connect much of the City. It is the longest city street in Lehi and is the only road that goes from Utah Lake to the low hills area of the City. It is a major connector that links to Pony Express Road, Pioneer Crossing, Lehi Main Street, and 2100 North. In the future it will connect to S.R. 92. It also connects Mountainland Applied Technology College, Thanksgiving Point, and the Larry Miller Megaplex Theaters to planned future development of more retail facilities and a hospital. 2300 West will also provide access to the UTA frontrunner and a number of UTA bus routes run along the road.



City Administrator Derek Todd is enthusiastic about the completion of the project, “The completion of 2300 West is a great accomplishment for Lehi City. We are excited to celebrate the opening of this important infrastructure with our residents.”

The grand opening celebration will take place on Friday, August 9th from 5:30 pm to 8:30 pm under the railroad bridge between Pointe Meadow Drive and 2150 North. The official opening ceremony will take place at 6:00 pm when Lehi City Mayor Bert Wilson will drive his 1934 Frazer Nash onto the street for the first time. Mayor Wilson will be followed by members of the Lehi City Council, as well as other classic car owners.

The remainder of the evening will be filled with free activities, including matchbox car racing, carnival games, music, raffles, and a classic car show by Rockin’ Hotrod Productions. There will be picture opportunities with a front loader that worked on the project, classic cars, a race car cut out, and the Miss Lehi royalty. Free hot dogs, chips, donuts, and drinks will be given away to the first 400 people.

Lehi City is grateful to all those that helped organize the celebration, including Jacques and Associates, the Lehi City Streets, Parks, Police, and Fire Departments, Goran Construction, Miller Motor Sports Park, Thanksgiving Point, and the Miss Lehi Royalty.
