LEHI CITY CELEBRATES FAMILIES WITH LEHI FAMILY WEEK

Week Full of Family-Centered Activities



Lehi, Utah | November 21, 2013 – For the past 13 years, Lehi City has taken one week to celebrate families and strengthen family relationships. This year's Family Week will be held from Sunday, November 24th to Saturday November 30th. The week is filled with activities from every part of the City.

On Tuesday November 26th, the Hutching's Museum will open its doors for half-price admission, and on Wednesday, the museum will host Wild Animal Fun. Each room in the museum will be filled with activities, games, and crafts for children as well as live animals on display. Museum Director and falconer Ben Woodruff recently acquired a bald eagle, and the bird will be revealed up close during Wild Animal Fun Day. Wednesday is also half-price swim day at the Lehi Legacy Center.

Lehi's annual Santa Parade tops off Family Week with Santa being led down Main Street by the Lehi Police and Fire Departments. The Parade concludes at the Lehi Main Street Plaza. There, families can enjoy complimentary hot chocolate and cookies, greet Santa, and listen to carols from a children's choir. The Lehi City Christmas Tree will also be lit as a part of the festivities.

One activity new to Family Week this year is the Family Unity through Reading Program. Families who signed up with the program and read at least 15 days together during November will receive a free book from the Lehi Library. A total of 81 families signed up for the challenge.

An integral part of Lehi Family Week is the members of the Lehi Family Week Committee. Some of the sponsored by the committee include a variety of discounts to local businesses, Family Week Opening Night with featured speaker Hilary Weeks, the Family Talent Show, and the Family Dance.

Lehi Mayor Bert Wilson is a strong supporter of Family Week and encourages everyone to attend the activities. "They provide a chance to strengthen the values we have and the blessing in our lives.... Memories are made up of the things we do and who we do them with, not the things we forgot to do or wish we had done," said Mayor Wilson.
