Lehi City, Utah | October 15, 2012 — The Lehi Downtown Revitalization project is near completion and Main Street will be open as a thoroughfare by October 29th—just in time for the City’s annual Trick-or-Treat on Main Street Parade on October 31st, from 4 - 6 p.m.

“I’m very pleased with the new look of our downtown. It creates an exciting gateway to the community that will draw in residents and new businesses,” said Mayor Bert Wilson. “Now is a great time to come check it out during the Trick-or-Treat on Main Street.”

Construction on Main Street began during May of 2011 and has been completed in phases since, with the final phase scheduled to be complete by October 29th. In addition to the new road surface, the City has added new sidewalks, pedestrian safety zones, turn lanes, lighting and new parking stalls off Main Street. Landscaping construction will continue after the opening date along with other minor improvements.



The City’s annual Trick-or-Treat Parade makes a loop on Main Street from 300 West to 200 East and draws in hundreds of families each year by providing a fun and safe way for children to trick-or-treat on Halloween.

“The parade is a great way to show off your costumes in a family friendly environment,” said Mayor Wilson. “It’s also a great time to come see the new look and feel of Lehi Main Street. Come ready for lots of treats and fun.”
