Open Burn Permits

As the weather improves and spring arrives, many residents will be found in their yards clearing away dead plants and trees to prepare for new life. If you plan to burn yard debris this spring, make sure you are aware of the state-mandated open burn regulations.

Residential burn season for Lehi runs March 30 to May 30. Residents are required to complete the open burn permit application at www.airquality.utah.gov/Compliance/OpenBurning/index.htm. After the application is completed and submitted, a copy of the application will be sent electronically to the Lehi Fire Department. The Fire Department will then issue the burn permit to the applicant for \$10. Contact the Fire Department at (801) 768-7130 for more information.

HEAT Program

Are you having trouble paying your gas and/or electric bills? You may qualify for the Mountainland HEAT Program.

What is it?

A program that offers one-time utility payment assistance for up to \$400, depending on household income.

Who qualifies?

You must be a U.S. Citizen or qualified alien, meet income guidelines, and be responsible for utility bills (directly or as part of a rent payment). You may qualify for an added credit if you have a child under 6 or if you or a member of your household is disabled or over 60 years of age.

How do I apply?

- Medications

- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Mercury thermometers
- Photographic chemicals
- Electronics (limit 2 sets per vehicle)
- Paper for Shredding
- Glass bottles and jars

What **NOT** to bring:

- Containers over 5 gallons in size
- Ammunition / explosives
- Compressed gas tanks / propane tanks
- Asbestos materials
- PCB- related materials
- Medical / biological waste
- Radioactive waste
- Fire extinguishers
- Business / commercial / construction waste
- Tires

Please do not mix wastes (bring in original containers if possible). Waste must be capped or sealed.
