Water Tip of the Month Mowing Tips for a Greener Lawn

Mowing frequently will thicken your turf and is less stressful for your lawn. Avoid cutting more than one third of the total grass length per mowing. Cutting an inch or less enables your mulching mower to work efficiently. Remember that sharp blades provide a cleaner cut. This will eliminate the frayed white tips and give your lawn a greener appearance. Your grass will also heal quicker and experience less drought stress.

Economic Development

Here's What's Happening in Lehi

Lehi is growing! The City's Development Services and Planning Department staff are staying busy with a number of commercial and residential projects planned or under construction. Here is a summary of what's happening:

IASIS Medical Center

The medical center, located at approximately 2000 West 3000 North, is currently under construction and is expected to be completed May 2015. The 2-story building will have 40 beds, an emergency department, 4 operating rooms, and a 3-story office building.

New High School


Alpine School District broke ground on the new high school on April 28. The new school will be located at 3200 North Center Street and is expected to be completed in 2016.

Commercial Development

A number of commercial office buildings area planned or under construction throughout Lehi. Development includes the UCCU Office Building and Traverse Ridge Center near SR-92; Mill Pond Plaza and Dry Creek Structures in South Lehi; and Traverse Medical Office on Traverse Mountain Boulevard. Restaurants planned or recently opened in Lehi include JDawgs, Café Zupas, Cubby's, Costa Vida, Zaxby's, and Chuck-A-Rama.

Residential Development

A number of areas are being developed for residential use, including single-family subdivisions, multi-family units, and a senior living community.
