Back To School Safety Tips for Parents and Students

As the new school year approaches, it's a great opportunity for parents to revisit safety rules and practices with their children. The majority of safety incidents can be avoided by prevention. The prevention process must begin with the appropriate awareness and knowledge to maintain a safe environment. These safety tips are offered to give you an opportunity to focus on the importance of safety.

Walking

- Supervise young children walking or riding to and from school.
- Children should use public sidewalks and cross the street at crosswalks, street intersections, and/or street corners.
- Teach children to recognize and obey traffic signals and pavement markings.
- Always look both directions when crossing the street and never enter a street between parked cars.
- Use the same route every day and avoid shortcuts.
- Try to have older children walk with other students.
- Avoid talking to strangers and never get into a vehicle with a person, even if they know them, without parent's permission.

Riding Bicycles

- Check with your local school to see if bicycles are allowed. Some schools do not allow children to ride bicycles until a specific grade.
- Make sure your child is wearing a helmet to and from school.
- Choose the safest route between home and school and practice it with your children until they can demonstrate traffic safety awareness.
- Obey traffic rules. The rules are the same for all vehicles, including bicycles.

Bus Safety

- Stand on the sidewalk or the edge of the street curb.
- Allow the bus to come to a complete stop.
- An adult should wait with young children until the bus arrives. Take turns with other parents monitoring the bus stop before or after school.
- Remain seated when on the bus and do not distract the school bus driver.
- Do not walk in the "driver blind spot" – the area from the front end of the bus to about 10 feet forward.

Driving

- Use the school's designated student drop off and pick up zone.
- Do not double park or make u-turns in front of the school.
- Students should enter and leave the car on the curbside in the designated drop off.
- Obey speed limit laws inside school zones.

In School

- Teach your children when and how to ask for help when dealing with a bully.
- Report to school officials if your child is being bullied and work with them on solutions.
- Teach children proper playground behavior: no pushing, shoving, or fighting.
- Do not share locker combinations with other students.
- Students and parents should try to go to orientation night and meet your teachers. It's good for them to know you before you arrive on the first day.


