Better Environmental Stewardship

Todd Munger is the manager of our Lehi City Environmental Sustainability Committee. He, along with the ten-member committee, has done a wonderful job at bringing forward best practices for all of us to better improve the physical world we live in and create a more sustainable future for our children. I asked Mr. Munger to share his efforts here in this month's ledger.

January is the month that ushers in a new year. Resolutions are made, goals are set, and results are expected. Our intentions are always to reach for what we know we can do better. These intentions often include eating better, exercising, spending more time with families, and of course being better stewards of our environment. Regardless of the resolution, the goal is the same, we want to live a better quality of life!

Sustainability rests on three pillars: Economic, Social and Environmental. These three pillars must be balanced for our community to thrive. Lehi City has experienced rapid growth that has benefited the economic and social pillars; however, the environmental pillar is suffering. Poor air quality, drought conditions, and inefficient recycling are just a few of the conditions challenging this pillar.

In 2019, Lehi City recognized the need to practice better environmental stewardship. A citizen appointed environmental sustainability committee was formed. A full-time position in the Community Development Division of the Planning and Zoning Department was created to help manage the committee. The establishment of the Environmental Sustainability Committee enabled the city much needed structure to organize and make sense of all the information associated with environmental stewardship.

The Environmental Sustainability Committee consists of five volunteer city residents, five city employees and five local businesses. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of each month. Discussions involve environmental issues such as air quality, water conservation/quality, energy consumption, active transportation, and recycling. Committee discussions lead to the creation of policy, educational outreach opportunities, participation in professional networks, and organized, sustainable community projects.

To date, Lehi City's environmental stewardship efforts have resulted in the following accomplishments. Received the 2021 Thomas A. Martin Recycler of the Year award for outstanding residential recycling practices that saved Lehi City \$251,408. Partnered with Texas Instruments, Mountainland Technical College, and Mountain Pointe Medical Center to collect electronic waste for the Computers for Kids non-profit drive. Partnered with the Rain Harvest organization to subsidize 200 of the 802 rain collection barrels purchased by residents to help conserve water. Developed a citywide grade school "No-Idling" project that placed "Turn Your Key, Be Idle Free Signs" in the pick-up/drop-off zones. Numerous Earth Day planting projects, trash collection efforts, and educational outreach tables.

As a community we are making a difference. The Environmental Sustainability Committee has created a short survey, published on the Lehi City's Engage Lehi information platform. The survey is intended to help the committee know what you think, so we can become better stewards of our environment. Please take a minute out of your busy schedules to let us know what you think.
