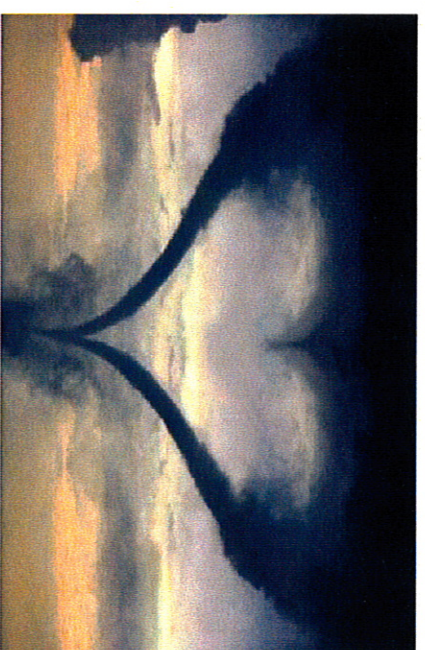

Emergency Response Plan

Lehi City recognizes that the best preparation steps residents can take are those that help them be more self-reliant in an emergency. We recommend that each family and individual in Lehi take steps to be ready for anything.

Lehi has prepared a Emergency Preparedness Manual, which has guidelines and information for Citizens, on what to do in the event of a disaster. You may get one of these manuals at the Building Department or at this fair. The Manual has recommendations for the following possible problems:

- Earthquake
- Fire
- Floods
- High Winds
- Power Outage
- Gas Leak
- Thunderstorms
- Winter Storms

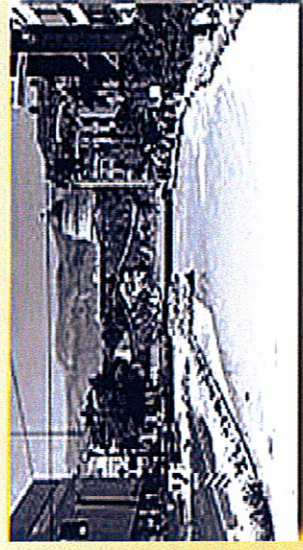




Together as a community we can rise above any emergency or disaster for we already know the meaning of brotherhood and the importance of our neighbors to each of us.

Churches, Community, Families, individuals and City leaders can work together and be ready for most problems that may arise.

Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so it is important to plan in advance; How you will contact one another; And what you will do in different situations.



Lehi City's role in the event of a disaster is to instigate an incident command system to determine where the needs are, and where we can best use our resources. An Emergency Preparedness Plan establishes areas of responsibility, a chain of command, and other specific guidelines to govern all emergency operations. There is an Emergency Operations Center, in place, to manage assign and track all resources.



Lehi City has made agreements with the Red Cross, Local Schools, churches, Fueling Stations, Questar, State and County Emergency contacts, for shelters, fuels, and any other needs that might arise. We have lists and agreements with local contractors for equipment and trucks to use for every contingency. The Plan includes maps of churches, schools, and other locations to be used as shelters. And in the event of an earthquake or other possible structure problems it designates inspectors to go check for possible structural damage and collapse, of houses and commercial buildings. They will tag all building as to whether they are safe or not.



Suggested items for every household:

- ◆ 72 Hour Kits for each member of the family
- ◆ Fire Escape Plan and drills
- ◆ Places to meet after an emergency
- ◆ Basic first aid kit and prescriptions
- ◆ Flashlights, Batteries, Radio, Candles
- ◆ Know where electrical and gas shut off switches are
- ◆ Emergency contact names & numbers
- ◆ Extra cash and personal documents
- ◆ Other suggested items in Lehi City Emergency Preparedness Manual
