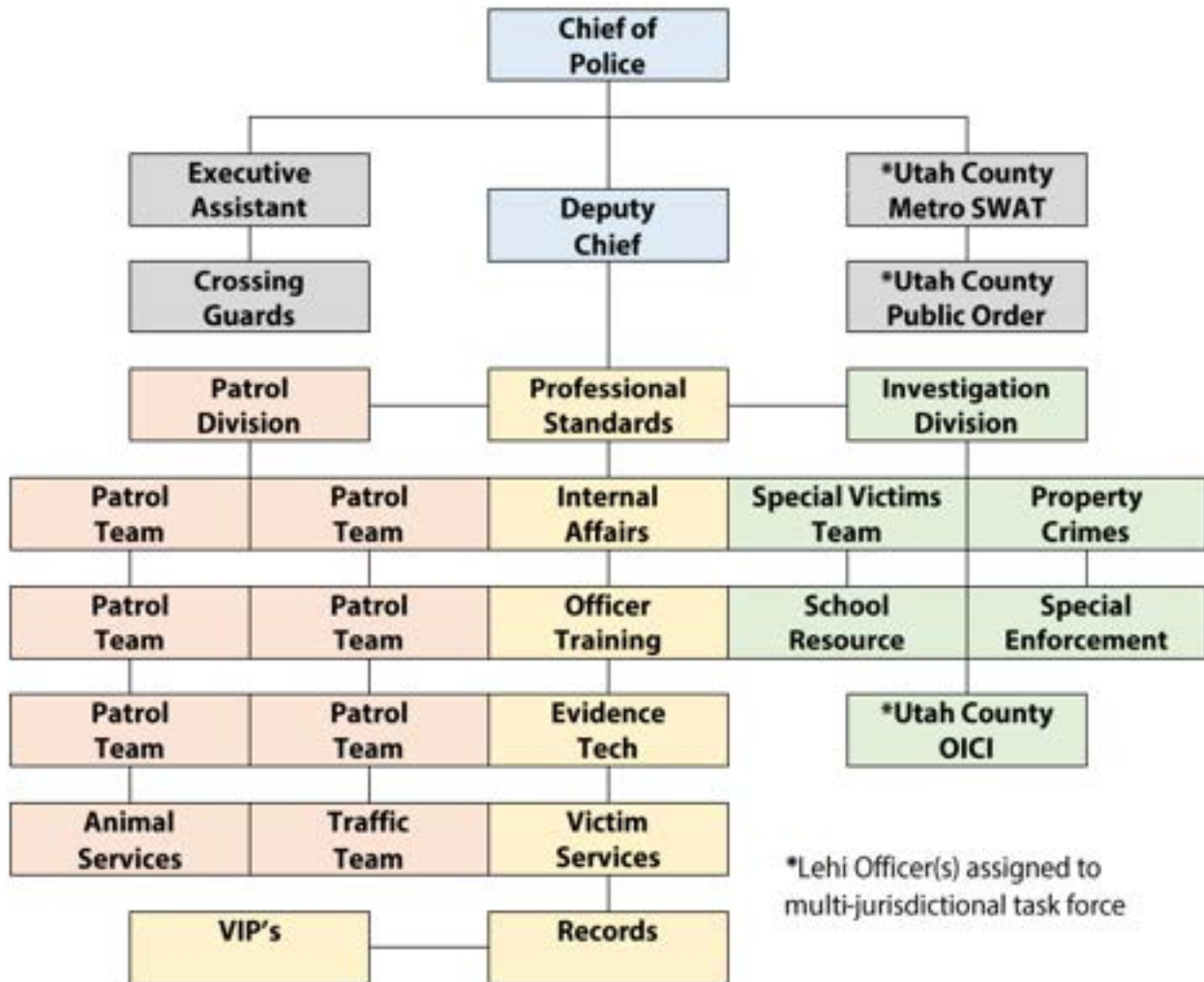

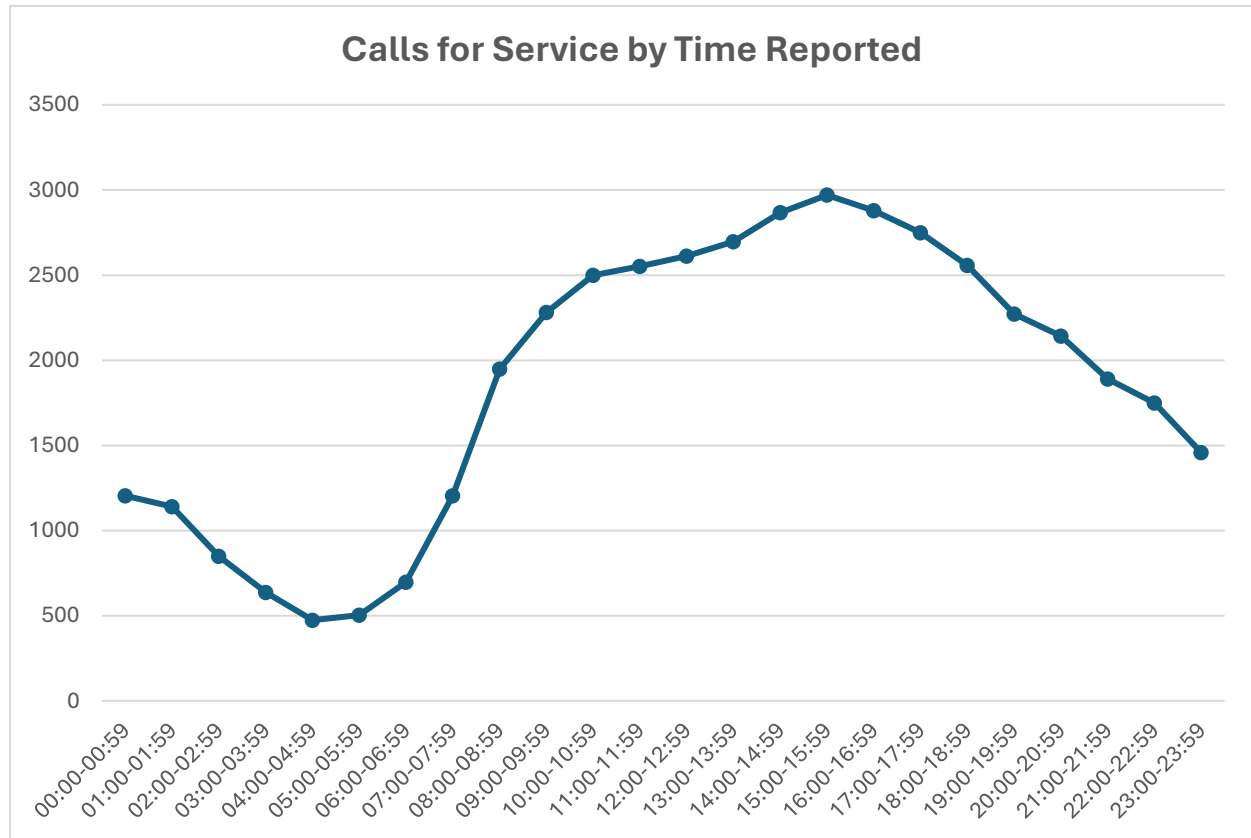

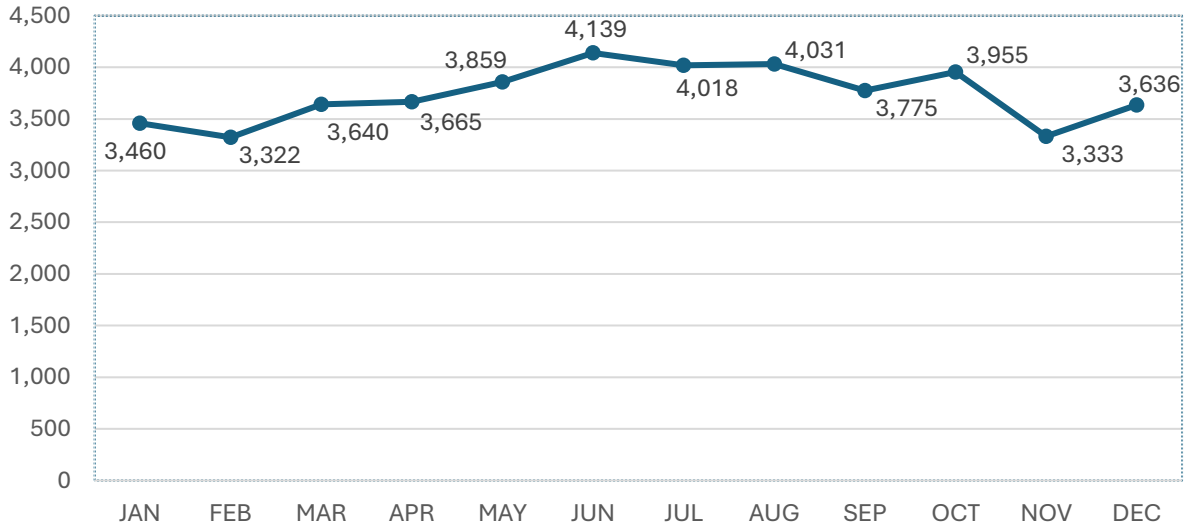




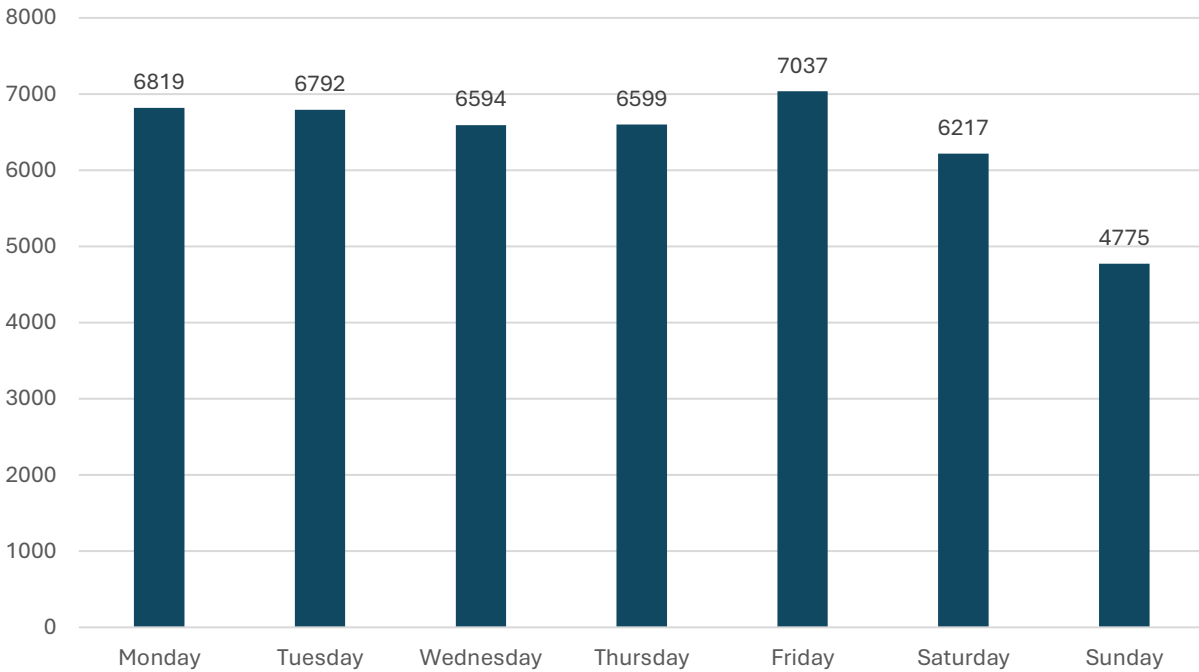

Priority 1 Calls (In Progress)

Calls that are in progress at the time the call is received, such as: robberies in progress, business and residential burglaries in progress, vehicle burglaries in progress, vehicle thefts in progress, kidnappings, aggravated assaults, homicides, dead bodies, assault on an officer, accident with injuries, assist fire department, weapons offenses, etc.

Priority 2 Calls (Just Occurred)

Medical calls, 911 hang-ups, thefts, thefts in progress, simple assault, robberies, DUI's, accidents without injuries, etc.

Priority 3 Calls (No Significant Threat)

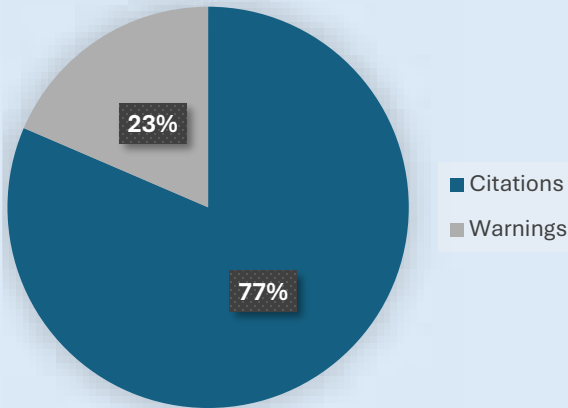
Crimes in progress that require an immediate response but present no significant threat of serious physical injury or major property damage or any active incident or activity that could be classified as a possible crime or potential threat to life or property.

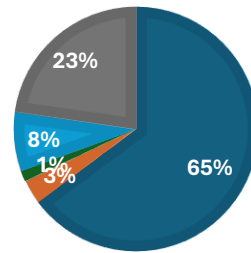
Traffic Stops

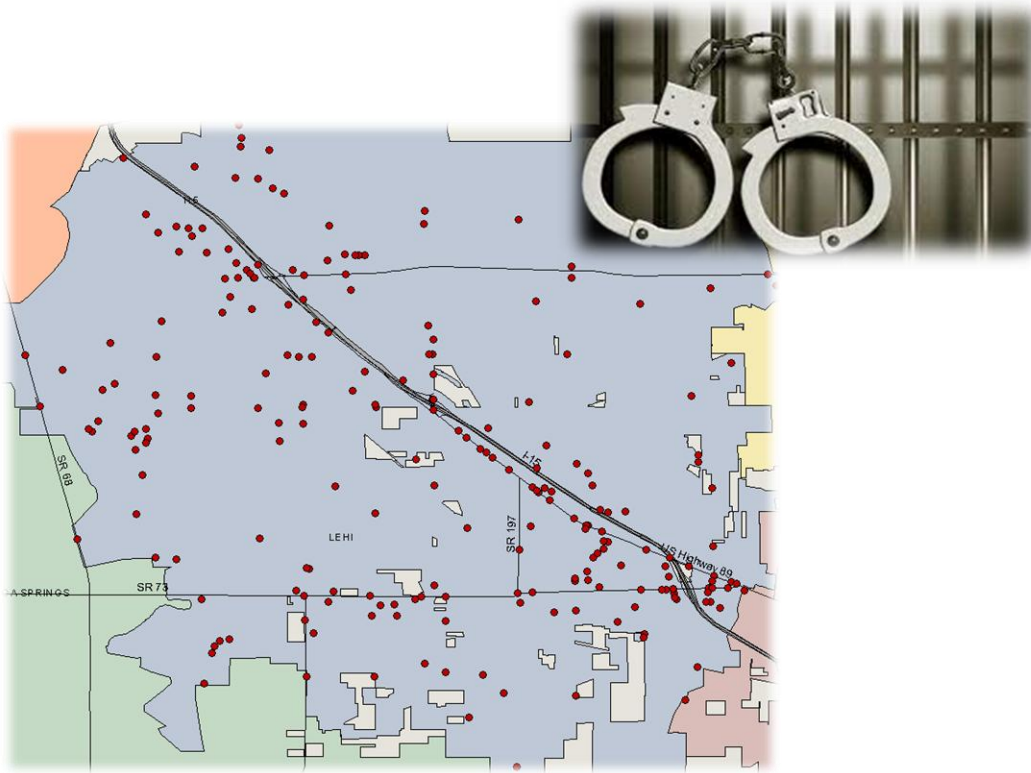

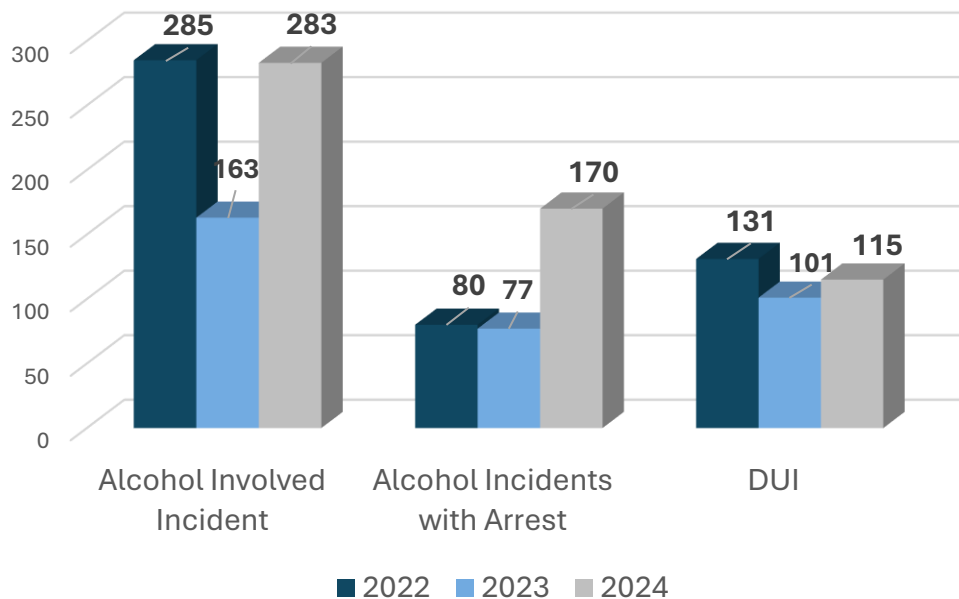


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Patrol Division Traffic Enforcement – DUI & Alcohol Offenses



DUI & Other Alcohol Offenses

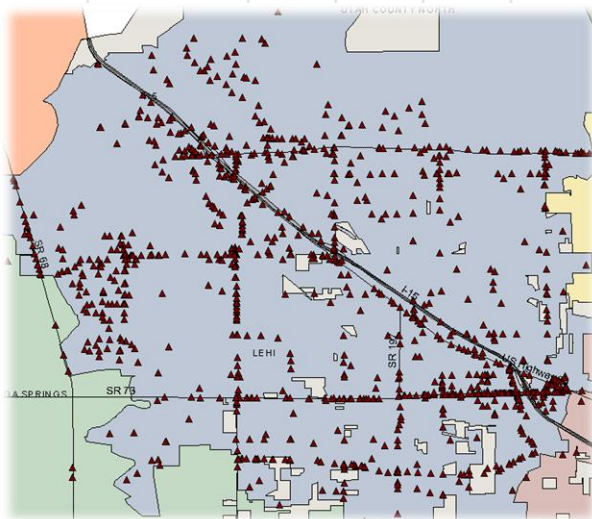

Investigations Division

The Investigations Division consists of 15 officers who are responsible for conducting ongoing investigations. Investigators are assigned to specialized teams supervised by a Sergeants, who in turn reports to a Lieutenant.

The investigative teams include:

- Special Enforcement Team
- Property Crimes
- School Resource Officers
- Special Victims Unit

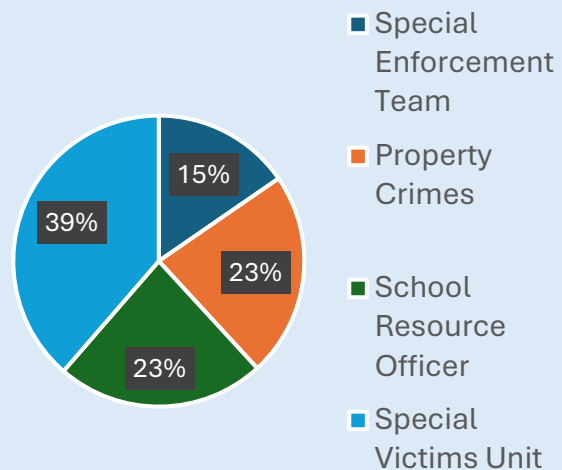
Criteria for assigning a case to the Investigation Division is based upon several factors including, but not limited to the type of crime, severity of crime, the need for on-going or additional follow-up.

Once a case has been assigned to the investigation’s division, the assigned investigator’s responsibilities include:

- Interviewing victims, witnesses and potential suspects of crime
- Crime scene management (identifying, collecting, documenting, and preserving evidence of crime
- Collaborating and coordinating investigations with various federal, state, and county agencies
- Working with prosecutors and courts to secure subpoenas, summons, and warrants

The Professional Standards Division consists of 4 officers and 16 civilian staff members. The division reports to a Lieutenant. The division is responsible for:

- Maintaining officer in-service training records
- Conducting internal investigations
- Coordinating Victim Services
- Securing and maintaining evidence
- Maintaining and disseminating police records
- Providing Lehi City Justice Court Security
- Overseeing the Lehi Police Department Volunteer Program
- Overseeing Lehi Cares Coalition

Professional Standards Division – Victim Services

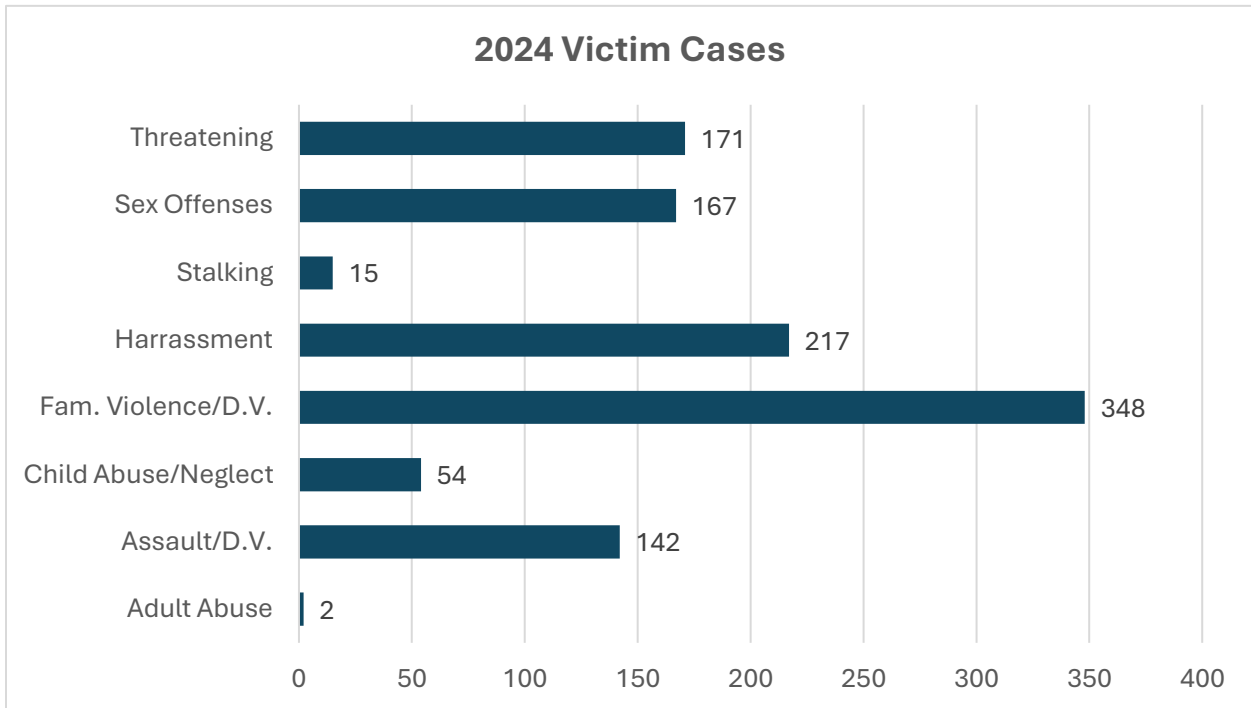
Lehi City Victim Services is dedicated to helping victims in need. Whether victims are in crisis or need victim resources, we are committed to ensuring that each victim is treated with respect and the victim’s concerns are heard.

Victim Services is designed to break the cycle of violence and to help victims become abuse-free and independent. The main objective is to help victims:

- Gain access to community resources
- Develop a safety plan
- Provide education, encouragement, and support

24 hour on-call assistance is offered, and community resources are available for victims of:

- Domestic violence
- Harassment
- Child abuse
- Unexpected death
- Stalking
- Sexual assault
- Elder abuse
- Homicide

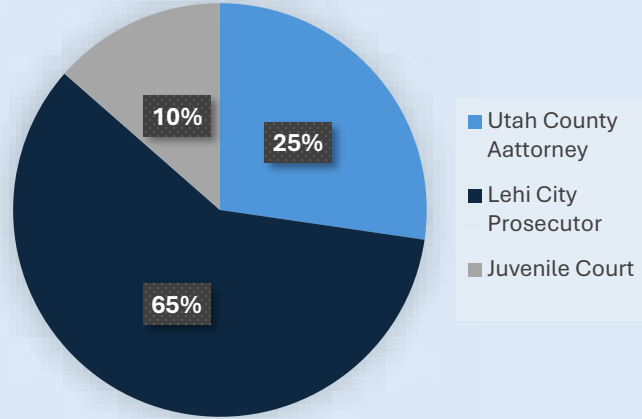




Professional Standards Division – Records & Evidence

Professional Standards Division – VIPS

The Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) Program provides citizens of Lehi an opportunity to be involved in our community by working directly with the Lehi City Police Department.

The Volunteers provide a variety of services to the community including:

- Mobile Neighborhood Patrols
- Unlocking vehicles
- Providing traffic control during city celebrations and other special events
- Assisting with non-emergency animal control calls

In addition to the community services provided by the Lehi City VIPS, Phil Wasden volunteers his time by serving as a Chaplain of Public Safety. Providing much needed support to the Lehi City Police Department as well as the Lehi City Fire Department.

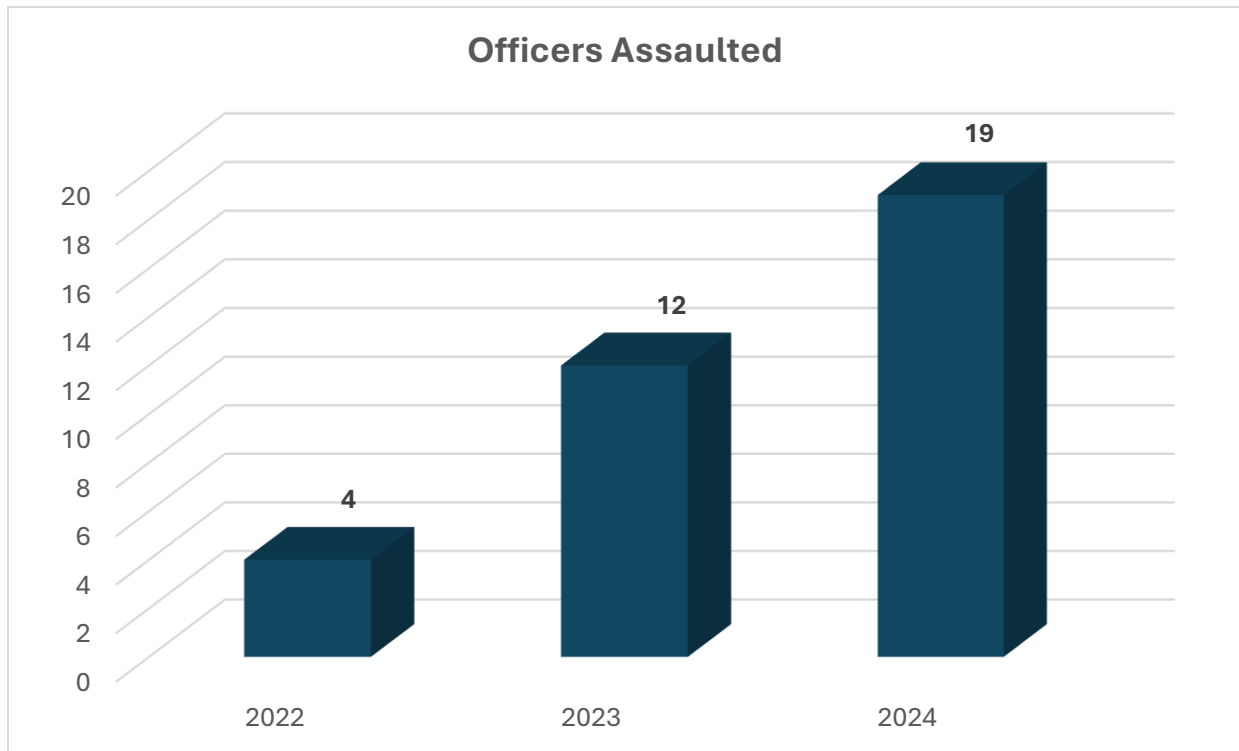
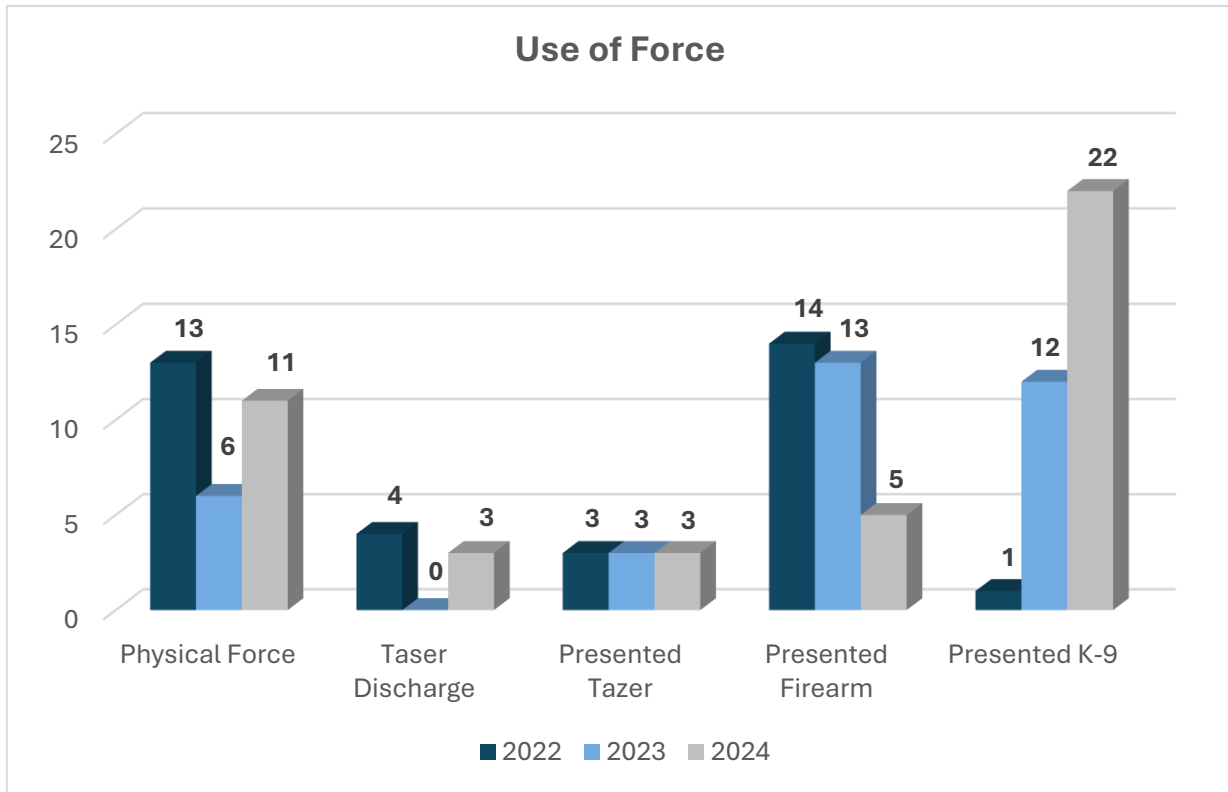

NIBRS

NIBRS vs. UCR Crime Reporting: How Crime Statistics are Collected

The Lehi City Police Department submits crime statistics to the Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI) and eventually the FBI using the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

What is NIBRS?

NIBRS is a method of collecting data based on each single incident and arrest. For example: During the commission of a residential burglary, the offender rapes and murders the homeowner. NIBRS counts three offenses: burglary, rape, and murder.

NIBRS categorizes crime into Group A and Group B offenses. Group A offenses include Crimes against Persons, Crimes against Property, and Crimes against Society. Crimes against Persons are those in which the victim is always an individual (i.e. murder, rape, assault). Crimes against Property are those which money or property is obtained from the crime (i.e. robbery, burglary, bribery). Crimes against Society represent society's prohibition against engaging in certain types of activity (i.e. gambling, prostitution).

NIBRS Group A Offenses include:

- Murder/Non-Negligent & Negligent Manslaughter
- Justifiable Homicide
- Kidnapping/Abduction
- Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Forcible Fondling
- Sexual Assault with an object
- Aggravated Assault, Simple Assault, Intimidation
- Incest
- Statutory Rape
- Robbery
- Arson
- Burglary/Breaking & Entering
- Extortion/Blackmail
- Larceny

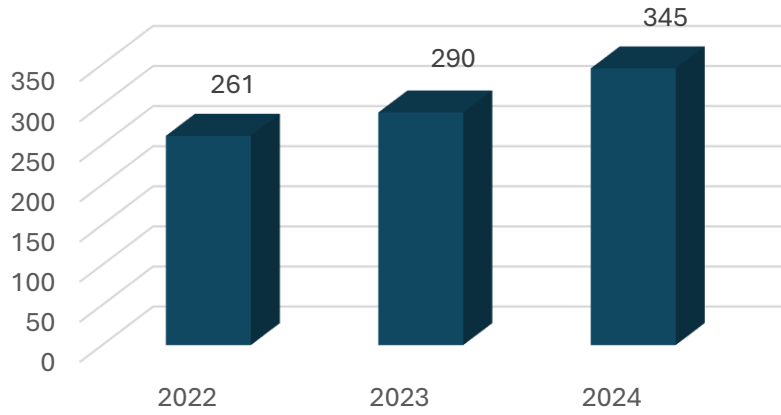
NIBRS Group B Offenses are only reported in the event of an arrest, and include:

- Bad Checks
- Curfew Violations/Loitering/Vagrancy
- Disorderly Conduct
- Driving Under the Influence
- Family Non-Violent Offenses
- Liquor Law Violations, Drunkenness
- Peeping Tom
- Runaways (Persons under 18)
- Trespassing
- All Other Offenses

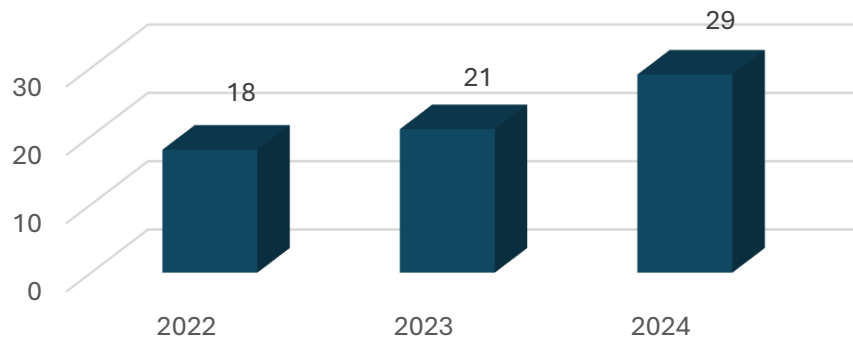
