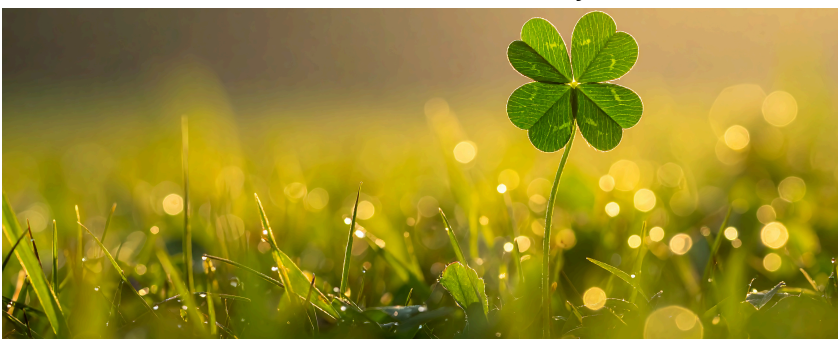

Universal Class - Universal Class is an online learning platform that offers self-paced courses on a wide range of topics—from professional skills and computer training to hobbies and personal enrichment. Library users can take classes anytime and even earn certificates of completion.

Creativebug - Creativebug is an online arts and crafts platform offering step-by-step video classes for all ages and skill levels. From painting and knitting to DIY projects and kids' crafts, it's a fun way to learn new creative skills anytime with your library card.

Libby - Libby is a free app that lets you borrow ebooks, audiobooks, and magazines from your library anytime, anywhere. Simply sign in with your library card to browse, borrow, and enjoy digital titles on your phone, tablet, or computer.

Our Spring ABC session began in January and will run through May 14, 2026. Our next ABC Session will be fall of 2026.
