Service Beyond the Ballot

As Lehi prepares for an election that will bring a new mayor and two new city council members, it is worth remembering that there are many ways to serve our community beyond elected office. While the service our newly elected officials will provide is valuable, the ongoing service offered by residents every day may be even more meaningful.

Whether it is volunteering on a city committee like Parks & Trails, Environmental Sustainability, or the Library Board, or simply lending a hand in your neighborhood, Lehi thrives because people choose to get involved. That spirit of volunteerism was on full display during the recent Lehi Day of Service, where more than 1,500 residents came together to contribute over 2,600 hours of service across the city.

From early morning setup to the last bags of debris being hauled away, the enthusiasm was contagious. Families, youth groups, church congregations, and civic organizations joined forces to clean, plant, and beautify public spaces that serve thousands of residents each day.

While the results were visible in the freshly planted trees and cleaner parks, volunteers said the most lasting impact came from connection. One participant shared, "It was so nice to be outside and improve a place that I love so much!" Another said, "Seeing my kids serve" was the highlight of the day.

At Spring Creek Park and other sites throughout Lehi, neighbors and strangers worked side by side. "It was good to be working alongside neighbors and friends to make our neighborhood better," one volunteer said. Another added, "Seeing people come together and get the job done in no time!"

The day was filled with smiles, laughter, and teamwork, with kids rolling in the dirt, friends celebrating completed projects, and families reflecting on how good it felt to give back. Many participants commented on how much they simply enjoyed being outdoors. "The weather!" one volunteer wrote, capturing the cheerful tone of the event. Parents expressed pride in watching their children serve, while youth groups learned firsthand how much can be accomplished when everyone shows up. As one team leader put it, "It's amazing what happens when people come together."

Whether through elected office, volunteer boards, or community cleanups, service is what keeps Lehi strong. Each shovel of dirt and each hour of time given represents pride in our shared home. As one participant summed up, "There's a lot of people, and a lot of help."

To everyone who contributed to this year's Day of Service, thank you. Your effort, enthusiasm, and kindness made a lasting difference. Together, we have proven once again that when Lehi serves, Lehi shines.
