He wrote the current history of Lehi City. His work needs to be carried on by the Scouts of Lehi District.

Photography Eagle Projects

There are ten Photograph Eagle Projects. One of these Projects can use four different Eagle Projects (Business Photography) Presently Eleven of these deal with Photography and can be used by all the boys for the Photography Merit Badge. (Requirement #4). (Six of these are in the process of being completed. There are also two more positions available for the Business Photography #1) The boys will take photographs and will be required to provide the photographs and provide them on a CD as a whole and an individual print of each photo, Also they will be required to write up a description, the date, and information about each photo.

The scout will document all businesses in Lehi in 2012. They will take photos of the business outside and inside. They will also photograph major business areas to compare to previous photos and future business district photos.

City Building and Utility Structures: Photographic documentation of Lehi City Buildings, utility shops and other Lehi City Buildings. Lehi Legacy Center, John Hutchings Museum, Fire Station, Police Station. Also key historical markers of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers, Lehi City monuments,, Liberty Land, Welcome to Lehi Signs, water plants, sewer plant, Lehi Railroad Museum electric lines and substations, sewer treatment plant, garbage dump, sewer pump stations and other civic and City structures.

Project #5 Photographic Documentation of Historical Sites:

Photographic documentation of the following: Thanksgiving Point, Liberty Land, A.F. Canyon, A.F. Canyon Sites, Timpanogas Cave infrastructure and caves, Camp Floyd building and park, inside and out, and all of the headstones at Camp Floyd cemetery. Also Traverse Mountain, the point of the mountain and the low hills above Lehi. Utah Lake sites around northern Utah County, Jordan River in Northern Utah County, Jordan River Walkway, Jordan River Bridges, and the point of the Mountain. The Rodeo Grounds and Willow Park.

Project #6 Photographic History of Homes in Lehi

The scout will find out about the early homes of Lehi. They will understand how the early pioneers built their early homes of adobe, wood and later brick. The scout will then go through old Lehi and take pictures of the original homes. The scout will look for adobe, early brick and wood homes. At each home he will fill out a form on each home. Individual hard copies of the homes will be presented. All the homes will be put on digitally on a disk for files. The scout will compile a list of homes made up adobe, made of early brick, and made of wood. There is no list. The scout will be helping us make this list.

Project #7 Photograph Documentation of City Employees, Departments, Civic groups, and City Committees.

Photograph of the City Employees, individually and as departments; Civic Improvement, Individually and as a group; American Legion individually and as a group; City Committees individually and as a group (parade, zoning, Hutchings Board of Directors, Historical Commission, Miss Lehi etc. ; Chamber of Commerce as a group; Legacy Center and Recreation Committees; and any other committee in Lehi.

AVAILABLE

Project #8 Agricultural Photography Documentation

Lehi is still has an abundance of Agricultural Enterprises and remains of prior Agricultural events. The Scouts will scour Lehi and the farms around the community. They will document by photography the farms, farmers, the equipment, the barns, the fields, the fences, the barbed wire, the animals and fields of the Community. Scout should have had a minimum 100 pictures. The Scout will provide a hard copy print of each picture and all the pictures on a disk. Each picture will be accompanied by a sheet which lists the date taken, address, what the piece of equipment and what it is for, the owner of the property, when the barn was built and what the exact animals are. It should also identify and individuals in the pictures.

Project #9 Photographic documentation of pioneer and old fences in Lehi.

The scout will travel throughout Lehi and document by photography all old fences in Lehi from pioneer days through the middle of the century. Scout will document where the fence is, who owns the fence, what material it is built of, how long the fence is, interesting qualities of the fence, and who is in the picture. The Scout will donate to the Archives one hard copy of each picture and then all photographs on a disk.

Project #10 Detailed Photography of the Hutchings Museum.

This scout project is to document the items in the Hutchings Museum, to document in photography all items that are displayed at the Hutchings Museum. A detailed paper description will be also be provided for each photo. The Scout will also provide two digital copies of all the photos.

Historical Projects

There are four projects dealing with the History of Scouting and the History of Lehi. One Scout will work on coming up with the history of Scouting in Lehi. Two others will work with other scouts in making a historical time line using one of the two histories of Lehi. Another Scout will scan the Biographies from the Lehi 1945 History Book and print out individual sheets for each biography for the Archives Biographical Files.

Project #11. Historical Scouting Artifacts of Lehi collection for the Lehi City Archives

This Scout Project will be to work on the history of Scouting in Lehi. Scout will contact each ward asking any ward members to donate stories, information, copy of photographs, documents, camp programs, award

banquet memorabilia that could be donated for the Scouting history of Lehi. Scout will identify and contact and interview key scouters from history, to have them write their stories and events of Scouting in Lehi down. These stories, photographs will be saved in the Lehi Archives for Scouters to access in the future. This will be a great service to Scouting and to Lehi.

The Scouts will then print out each of the bibliography of each person individually including the picture. These will be placed in a Historical files of residents of Lehi.

Woodworking Projects

Project #15 Wood Holder for blueprints, plans and maps.

We have a woodworking project. The Archives has a bunch of plat maps, blueprints of the Lehi Memorial Building, Old Lehi High School, Tabernacle, and other buildings, churches and schools. We need a wood box that can securely hold these plot plans in tubes to protect them. The scout will raise the money for the project, construct it and finish the holder for approximately 50 tubes. These old blueprints are wide and necessary for larger than normal tubes.

Project #16 Wood Holder for oversized photographs

This is another woodworking project. The Archives has a collection of oversized photographs that need to be stored and protected. We will need to have a case build with slotted sections to hold oversized photographs. The scout will raise the money for the project, construct it and finish the holder for these photographs. This will save hundreds of pictures from damage.

Project #17-19 Lehi Free Press bound Holders

The bound historic Lehi Free Press are moving to the Lehi City Archives. We need three Scouts to build three holders for the Bound Historical Lehi Free Presses. We will need these to be built like the ones at the Library which currently hold them. The Librarians will show the Scout and Leaders the book shelves that need to be copied.

These will be a lasting project for the Archives and the Lehi Free Press.

Project #20-21 Book Cases for Oversized Books

The Archives are in need of two large bookcases to hold over-sized books. The Scout will raise money for and build two large bookcases for the Archives to hold very old and expensive historical books.

Citizen Interview Story Breakdowns

The Citizen Interviews will break the interviews of Lehi Citizens into individual stories.

Project #17 Citizen interviews-Category Division.

The Scouts will take the Citizen Interviews posted on the Lehi City Website and break the interviews into Categories. For example if they are talking about the Mulliners Mill, then the discussion about the Mulliner Mill is accessed on a separate paper to be filed by Categories that are used by the Lehi Archives.

The Scouts will provide separate pages for each category by Citizen. This will make these oral histories pertinent to research. We will be able to file their stories with the category of their topic. This is a great service to the History of Lehi. These will be put into the Lehi City Archives.

Histories of the Local Schools

There are eleven schools for scouts to work on the histories of the schools. There is also a project to document the historical history of the Lehi High School.

Project #18-27 Prepare a history of one of the Lehi Schools period for one of the Lehi Schools.

Each Scout will choose a school and will work with the Administration, teachers and students to prepare a history of that school. Stories, history, photos and other memorabilia will be prepared to be donated to the Lehi Archives on behalf of the School, the administration and the school. Any photographs should be hard copies.

Each of these categories will be on a separate sheet showing the details from all the years of Lehi High School History. Information can be retrieved from the yearbooks and histories at the High School.
