

5. Any member who shall appear at any meeting of the department, or at any fire, intoxicated, shall be subject to expulsion.
6. At all annual or monthly meetings or for the election of officers, ten members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
7. Any member refusing to obey the orders of the officers in charge, or in any way interfere with their duties by giving counter orders, shall be stricken from the roll.
8. The chief shall have charge of the property of the department, and keep the same in good repair and shall annually make a report in writing to the department, at the first meeting in May of all the property and finances belonging to the department, and also to discharge all other and further duties required of him.
9. Any member having served 5 years of honorable, consecutive service thereafter shall be entitled to a seat as an honorary member of the department, and no others shall be admitted as honorary member.
10. It shall be the duty of the secretary to furnish each Justice of the Peace in Lehi annually, a certified list of the names of all members of the department in good standing.
11. All applications for membership, made at any meeting of the department shall be referred to a committee of three members, to be appointed by the chief. Such applications shall lie over until the next meeting before being acted upon.
12. After such applications for membership is reported upon by the committee, a ballot shall be taken by white and black ball ballots, when if three black balls appear the applicant shall be rejected and if three black balls do not appear the applicant shall be declared elected.

13. The chief shall at every monthly meeting report to the department the condition of the fire apparatus, and the secretary shall enter such report in his records of the meetings.
14. Any member who shall be guilty of using abusive or obscene language to any officer or member while in session or on duty, or for incompetency, or for neglect of duty, shall be subject to expulsion by a two-thirds vote of the members present, at any regular meeting of the department.
15. These bylaws may be altered or amended by a resolution, in writing setting forth the proposed number offered at any regular meeting of the department. Such resolution shall be referred to a committee of three members, and shall lie over one regular meeting, if two-thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative, it shall be adopted and become part of the bylaws.

The above Constitution and Bylaws have been amended approximately thirteen times since 1901.

The last change being 1999.
