Lehi Walk of Fame Honorees

This is a sentimental and humorous tribute to one of our earliest folklore heroes in Lehi. This will be at the Glen Smith Theater at the Art Center. There will be shows at 4, 5, and 6 p.m. Free tickets are available at Wines Park following the Walk of Fame program.

Primary Elections

Vote By Mail

Lehi City is conducting an all vote by mail for the Primary and General Elections. Ballots were mailed to registered voters beginning July 14, 2015. Completed ballots must be postmarked on or before August 10, 2015, in order for the vote to count. A drop box location will be available at City Hall (153 N 100 E) now until August 11 if the voter prefers to submit the ballot in person. The drop box is located at Utility Billing. Registered voters can also surrender their ballot and vote in person at City Hall on August 11, from 7 a.m.- 8 p.m.

Duplex Homes

Message From Code Enforcement

Quite often, we get asked if basement apartments are allowed in Lehi City. Basement apartments, mother-in-law apartments, etc., are classified as duplexes by the Lehi City Development Code and are only permitted in multi-family zones.

In order to legally convert a single family home into a duplex, a homeowner must contact the Community Development Department for a conditional use permit. The homeowner must also obtain a building permit. Conversion from a single-family home to a duplex requires altering the structure and is independent of the relationship between residents. In other words, creating a situation where two families can live in the same home independently from one another, regardless of relationship, is not permitted in any of the City's single-family residential zones.
