## Mass Gathering & Event Permits Know When You Need a Permit

### Special Event Permits (Lehi City)

1. Private functions such as a fundraiser, party, race, oversized group picnics, etc., that
2. intend to use Lehi City property, including roads, sidewalks, parks, etc., in a way that
3. may interfere with the public's typical use and/or
4. require the dedication of additional city staff or services.

### Mass Gathering Permit (County)

Any event with 500 or more people, which will last for at least 2 hours, at a site that was not designed for that type of occupancy.

Mass Gathering Permits are required for public or private property.

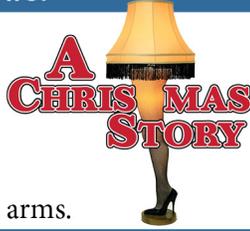

# Fire Department Tip Smoke Detector Maintenance

Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms play a vital role in reducing fire deaths and injuries. In fact, smoke alarms have contributed to almost a 50% decrease in fire deaths since the late 1970s. On average, home fires kill 540 children under the age of 14 each year. The International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) reports that while 96% of American homes have at least 1 smoke alarm, 19% of detectors are not working, mostly due to dead batteries.

It's recommended that smoke detector batteries be changed twice a year. Daylight Saving Time is an easy reminder to check your batteries. It's also a good time to clean out detectors as they can collect dust, dirt, or other foreign matter that can change the sensitivity of the sensing elements. To do this, use a high-powered vacuum cleaner by placing the nozzle as close as possible to the openings of the outside housing. A dirty detector, low battery, or missing battery can activate an alarm or multiple alarms, depending on the age of the detector.

Many newer detectors are smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) detectors. CO is a deadly, colorless, odorless, poisonous gas. It's produced by the incomplete burning of various fuels and equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, such as portable generators, cars, and lawn mowers. The initial symptoms of low to moderate CO poisoning are similar to the flu (but without the fever). They include: headache, fatigue, shortness of breath, nausea, and dizziness. High level CO poisoning can cause mental confusion, vomiting, loss of consciousness, and ultimately death.

If your alarms become activated and anyone is showing symptoms, call 911 for medical care and CO investigation. The fire department has the tools to detect CO inside your home and poisoning in your bloodstream.
