## *From Mayor Wilson*

### Communication and City Happenings



In 2015 our city saw great residential and commercial growth, and it continues with no end in sight.

Last year our building department issued 1,080 total residential and commercial building permits. We are happy to have the new jobs they create and the great people that move here. We had all better say that we enjoy the traffic because at the rate Utah continues to grow this will become the Good Old Times.

So far this winter the snow has been good to us. Our streets division worked many hours over Christmas to make sure our roads were safe, plowing approximately 5,300 lane miles. Most roads were plowed several times in order to keep up with new snow.

I want to take a second to explain the process that the streets division follows to plow the roads (I've had several conversations with residents about this). First, the trucks plow down the middle to open a path to travel. Next, the trucks plow the roads again to widen out the road. Finally, the trucks come back and push the snow as close to the curb as possible.

This makes room for police, fire, mail, and garbage vehicles to reach your home without getting stuck. No one wants a garbage truck stuck in the front yard. People will think you are doing your spring cleaning early!

We appreciate your patience as our crews work. In the event we get more snow, please remember to get your cars off the streets and keep your sidewalks clear. If our plows push the snow onto the sidewalk, please shovel it again to make room for new snow. I know this is a pain, but there is no way we can drive all the streets with mini plows to clear the sidewalks. Look at it as a blessing because we need the snow. Thanks to all who shovel the snow off their sidewalks the first, second, and third times.

On another note, please don't idle your cars to warm them up. This is an easy way for a thief to drive off with your vehicle. We also don't need the pollution from idling cars or frequent trips to ruin what clean air we have during the inversions. Clean air is a premium and we all need to do better. Wood burning stoves are great to have, but they are also a great source of pollution. Let's all try to do a little better and we will see great gains in air quality.


