

Lehi Block Company

The Lehi Block Company, founded by Edward S. Fox and Arthur T. Powell, began processing pumice stone building blocks in July 1945. The first shipment of blocks was purchased by the First Presbyterian Church of American Fork.

Eventually Powell purchased Fox's interest and continued to expand both the plant and the market until his retirement. In 1989, under the management of Mac Powell, employs fifteen people and manufactures 275 different types of brick made of expanded shell concrete, volcanic cinder, and pumice.

Their daily output is 10,000-15,000 bricks.
