Communication and City Happenings



I have had several individuals ask, "Why are you closing Porter's Place on Main Street?" I'm not one to spread gossip, but the fertilizer has been spread enough.

Let me give you a little of history. In 2008 Mr. Trepanier, the owner of Porter's Place, had an opportunity for another investment at the point of the mountain. He chose to sell his building on Main Street to Lehi City. When the other opportunity failed, he wanted to buy back the building, at which time Lehi City chose not to sell the property.

For the past six years rumors have been going around saying that the City is forcing Porter's Place to leave. This is quite the contrary. The truth is, we are not closing Porter's nor do we have any intentions of closing it. Mr. Trepanier and Lehi City have been under contract since 2008. Porter's Place rents from Lehi City and pays the applicable taxes. This is conducted in a way that all good business is done.

Porter's Place has chosen to relocate to Nephi in June. We wish them the best and hope that they are successful. So if you hear a good rumor, you will now know the other side of the story.

Now, on to something a bit more interesting. Lehi is booming. We currently have 4.2 million square feet (that's four million two hundred thousand square feet) of office space under construction or approved for construction. To put that in perspective, that's 96.41 acres of property laid out flat; or 24 city blocks stacked on top of each other.

Imagine the number of people coming to Lehi to live and work. To make this all come together, we have approximately 3,765 residential lots approved, and many are under construction. Our current population is about 60,000 people and that is projected to double by 2040. At the current rate of growth we will double in size much sooner than that.

As the city grows lifestyles will change. The younger generation will adapt with no problem, but for us older folks, it may be hard to wrap our fingers around. I do know this. Regardless of if you have been in Lehi for 50 years or 50 days, there is room for everyone. We can learn to accept each other and be good neighbors.

The days of open space are going away fast. The days of watching pheasants in the field or farmers cut hay are just about gone. Change in attitude is good. It's like changing your socks and underwear; you may
