Utah County Elections

Poll Workers needed

The Utah County Elections Office is recruiting poll workers to staff the polling locations for the 2016 Presidential Election. This is a unique opportunity for Utah County residents to both serve their community and have a hands-on experience with the election process.

The Presidential Primary Election will be held on June 28, 2016. Primary Early Voting will be held from June 14 - June 24, 2016. The Presidential General Election will be held on November 8, 2016. General Early Voting will be held from October 25 - November 4, 2016. Help is needed county-wide.

There is a stipend of \$150 for Poll Clerks. Early Voting Clerks receive \$10 per hour. Poll Managers will receive a stipend of \$225. Early Voting Poll Managers receive a stipend of \$12 per hour. All Early Voting poll workers are required to work every day of Early Voting.
