Helpers must be income eligible (earn less than \$1,915 per month for singles and \$3,102 for couples), be willing to serve 15 hours per week, and have a desire to help others. 
Library News It's Halloween Time!

Flu Vaccine for Seniors Vaccination for Those 65 & Older

Did you know there is a special flu vaccination just for individuals 65 years and older? The Center for Disease



Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices recommend that all seniors receive an annual flu shot and specifically suggest receiving the high dose flu vaccination.

Studies show that seniors get better protection with this vaccine. The Utah County Health Department currently has high dose flu vaccines in stock in its Provo, American Fork, and Payson clinics.


