### **1850-1950 Centennial Biography**

George A. Lewis was born May 4, 1889 in Lehi, Utah, the son of Henry and Jane Goodey Lewis. He received his early education in the Lehi public schools later attending Lehi High School.

He was baptized and confirmed into the Latter-day Saint Church, October 9, 1897. He was ordained into the different offices of the Priesthood by his father, becoming an Elder in 1912.

On January 9, 1908, he married Ruia Bushman of Lehi. The the union were born five children, namely G. Merwyn, Lynn A., Jack D., Nedra (Mrs. T. D. Roberts, Cleora, (Mrs. G. H. Radebaugh).

He took an active part in Church activities. He was a member of the Old Folks Committee for twelve years. He was very active in civic and community affairs and gained such satisfaction in serving the public. He is a member of the Lions Club, serving as President in 1941.

He served as mayor of Lehi in 1944 and 1945.

He is a charter member of the Lehi Civic Improvement Association serving as President since 1947. He also served as deputy Utah County assessor for four years.

Being a great lover of livestock and the soil he took up farming in his early life. He has been a continuous livestock and poultry producer for 20 years.

He is a liberal and progressive citizen deeply interested in the growth and development of Lehi.
