

Jane Zada Webb Phillips

1850-1950 Centennial Biography

Jane Zada Webb Phillips was born July 19, 1920 in Lehi, Utah, a daughter of Eugene and Ann E. Smith Webb. She graduated from Lehi High School in 1938. While there she helped in music, drama and other activities. She also served as Student Body Vice President where she was a senior.

In the summer of 1937 to 1938, she worked in the Lehi Cannery. This cannery was owned by Byron Whipple and Lowell Brown. George Carson being foreman at this time. In the fall of 1938 she went to work as cashier at Taylor Brothers Department store in Provo, Utah. She worked there until her marriage.

She is a charter member of the Liahonian Club, a literacy club which was organized in 1943. She has been active in Church ;work since the age of 14, when she became an assistant organist in the Second Ward Primary. Since then she has helped as Sunday School chorister, organist, Primary and Relief Society organist, Stake Beehive leader and later as ward organist.

She was married to Jean L. Phillips, September 6, 1939, by Steven L Chipman in the Salt Lake Temple. They have made their home in Lehi since that time. They now have two daughters named Sandra Jean and Barbara Jane. (They had another daughter after this time).
