Utah County Health Community Injury Prevention

The Utah County Health Department's Injury Prevention Program announces the availability of \$1,000 in community funding available for projects that work to prevent childhood injuries. Funding must be used for project materials (I.E. car seats, life jackets, bike helmets, etc.).

Projects that have been funded in the past include bike helmets for schools holding bike safety activities, long board helmets and signs on the Provo River Trail, car seat class and booster seats for daycare centers that transport children to and from school.

Proposals should be based on one of the following topics:

- safe infant sleep
- child passenger safety
- drowning prevention
- helmet use preventing traumatic brain injury.

Any group or individual with an injury prevention project idea is encouraged to apply. To apply, submit the mini grant proposal form and the application via email to carrieb@utahcounty.gov by 1 p.m., January 18th, 2016.
