



Boy Scout and Similar Group Lane Reservations

To ensure a place in the pool, scout troops or similar groups must rent and reserve a lap lane for one hour during designated available lap lanes times. There is a maximum of 2 lanes for rent available at any one time. Scout troops or similar groups will not be allowed to take up a lap lane if they have not reserved and paid for it.

Lap lanes can be rented up to 3 months in advance, and we suggest to secure a reservation at the least a week in advance. If a lane is available, it is possible to rent the lane when they get here. There are certain times of the day that there will not be any lane lines available for scout use.

The cost is \$12 per lane per hour for up to 10 scouts and ½ the regular admission price per person after that. **Lap lane rentals are paid over the phone with the Aquatics Manager or at the pro shop (not the front desk).** Scout masters or leaders of a similar group are not included as part of the 10 and should not be charged extra. Admission payment is not required for a lane rental and the group will not receive wrist bands unless they intend to stay after their hour and play, in which case they need to pay the ½ price admission per person plus the lane fee of \$12.

Lap lane rental fee must be paid for at time of reservation or lane will not be reserved.

Scout troops and similar groups must obey the pool rules when renting a lap lane. Do not hang on the lane lines at any time. If a lane line is broken, the group will be responsible for replacing it.

Lap lane rentals cannot be used for personal gain and are intended for groups only.

Non-reservations

Boy Scout troops or similar groups are welcome to use the Aquatics Center during public hours to work on skills pertaining to aquatics. They are welcome to use the leisure pool, **as long as they do not interfere with any programs or patrons. The lap pool is unavailable for use by groups without a reservation.**

If a scout troop or similar group does not rent a lane line ahead of time there is **no guarantee** that they will find a place to work on their requirements.

If a scout troop or similar group comes in that has not reserved a lap lane and want to work on requirements, the front desk must call the Aquatics Manager on duty who will come up to the lobby and discuss with the leader the possibility of using a lane or having space to work on their requirements.

If a lane is not reserved then all of the participants must pay the regular fee which is ½ off the daily admission rate if they are working on requirements.

If a group comes in to swim but is not working on any requirements they would pay the group rate instead.
