## From Councilor Paige Albrecht Lehi's Inspiring Youth



Spring is finally on its way, and you can definitely tell from our parks! With all the sports teams practicing on busy fields and kids crowding

onto the playground equipment, it's no surprise that 42.6% of the population in Lehi is under 18 years old. Our city is full of young people, and everywhere you look they are making a big difference for good.

This past month, the Council heard an impressive presentation from a young man who wants to help build a mountain bike skills park for our local school biking teams. He followed up with the Parks Committee to see how to continue forward. Our Miss Lehi visited Lehi Elementary to teach about physical activity and mental health. The Utah Military Academy cadets conducted an inspirational flag ceremony at City Hall. In fact, there are often more kids than adults at many of our civic meetings.

I've seen multiple social media posts lately by young people who are working hard on volunteer service, everything from making sleeping mats for the homeless to collecting stuffed animals for donations to the needy. A widow went online to thank the kids who shoveled the snow on

her walkway. One person even posted that their 6 year old is looking for ideas to help others, and another grateful person spoke of some teenagers helping them after a car accident.

I've always said that one of my favorite things to do as a Council member is to meet with local youth groups. No matter how discouraging things might get, their positive attitudes always inspire me. To earn the Citizenship in the Community Merit Badge, Scouts are required to learn about local government. One question they usually ask is, "What can kids like us do to serve in the community?" My challenge to the adults in Lehi is to follow the example of our children and ask ourselves the same question.

I was glancing over some old articles recently in the Lehi Banner newspaper from way back in April 1901. Amidst the stories of the sugar beet factory, the new Oregon Short Line railroad, the drought's effects on the flour mill, and the Tabernacle Easter celebration, someone had taken the time to include a brief paragraph that said, "What a host of young people there are in Lehi. Yes! and the best of it is that they are good."

Fortunately, some things never change.


