The Volunteer Spirit of Lehi



Earlier this summer, Lehi was fortunate enough to sign a 50-75 year lease agreement with Utah County Willow Park. For just \$5 per year and a commitment

to maintain the property, Lehi now has the chance to add some things many residents have been asking for, like a better kayak launch at the Jordan River and a dog park. But while the land may be practically free, installing the facilities definitely won't be.

This isn't the first time Lehi has faced this kind of challenge. A notable example is one of my favorite places in all of Lehi, Wines Park. In 1908 it was gifted to Lehi by Ira Wines as a memorial to his late wife, Margaret, with the same stipulation: Lehi City had to build and maintain it. The estimated price for this was \$500 per year and didn't include the cost of initial landscaping. Newspapers from the time document that many residents worried that Lehi couldn't afford it, even with free land. So how did they do it?

I think we can all guess the answer: they rolled up their sleeves and went to work. Old growth trees were dynamited and the citizens leveled the ground. "The boys of the grammar grades...

cleared the block of all undergrowth and such like" (Salt Lake Herald-Republican, December 21, 1910). Later on, "A report of the work on the Wines Park was heard and a day for cleaning it of rocks, etc. discussed. Grade and High School students will assist in the work" (Lehi Sun, March 22, 1916). The local gardening club then installed hundreds of rose bushes. And by October of 1920, the Lehi Sun reported that "...Wines Park is developing into a real asset to Lehi City. Each year now will see the park growing in value and its benefits will be had by the citizens in general." How right they were!

Many of us have enjoyed the shade of Wines Park trees that are decades old, but did you know that some of them were installed as part of a fundraiser? In a special council meeting, "The matter of letting public spirited citizens buy and name trees for the Wines Park came up and it was decided to charge 50 cents each for them" (Lehi Sun March 22, 1916). Just think of that! For only three dollars, residents could contribute six trees to build a park that we all still enjoy today.

Three dollars in 1916 equals almost exactly \$75 in today's money, and for that same price you can make your own lasting contribution to building a Lehi park. The Parks Committee is currently holding a fundraiser to build
