



Planting in the Park Strip of or close to a sidewalk?

There are restrictions on where you can plant your trees and shrubs.

Here are a few friendly reminders on placement and spacing within a Right of Way area.

- Never plant trees directly under power lines.
- 10' from a power transformer.
- 35' from a stop sign, school zone warning sign, or pedestrian crossing sign.
- 40' from a traffic light.
- 25' from a street intersection.
- 10' from a fire hydrant.
- 5' from a water meter.
- 20' from a light pole.
- Trees need to be centered in the Park Strip area.
- Trees planted on private property need to be placed 4' away from the sidewalk.

Lehi Community Forestry ordinances Chapter 35 pertain to all vegetation within the Right of Way areas.

Any tree or shrub can cause conflict with any utility or structure. There is no guarantee that conflict will not arise in the future.

Any new tree installed later will require a new permit application to be approved and the current Chapter 35 ordinances shall apply at that time.
