

The word "pioneer" can be used in a variety of ways as defined by Webster's dictionary. When used as a noun, it's most often used to describe one of the first to settle in a territory. This is how I think of the word in relation to my pioneer ancestors. They crossed the plains back n the 1800's to help settle Utah.

The way I want to talk about the word "pioneer" is when used as a verb, which is to open or prepare others to follow OR to originate or take part in the development of. To pioneer in this way is nothing new to Lehi. At the recent Heritage Day's events Mayor Mark Johnson talked the origins of Lehi's power department where he referenced Mayor Joseph Broadbent who was upset when informed by Utah Power and Light (Lehi's power company at the time) in June of 1925 that the rates for the 183 street lights in operation was going to be tripled. With that news the Mayor and City Council decided to take action and voted to create its own municipal power plant, which opened on June 15th, 1927. That pioneering spirit continues in Lehi Power as evidenced by the construction of our own co-generation plant. The plant began operations in July of 2018 to help with peak loads especially during the summer months. As a result of that early (and ongoing) pioneering decisions we are still

one of the few municipal power companies in the state and recipients of some of the best rates and service!

As a city we continue to pioneer to help our citizens. Earlier this month on September 6, we had a ground breaking, or more accurately a, "fiber cutting" to begin construction of the fiber project that we've been working on for the past several years. With the start of this project we'll be able to provide internet via fiber to every home in Lehi. The completion of the project is anticipated to take about 3 years with the first homes anticipated to have service as early as spring of 2023. With that 3-year project timeline, I think it's pretty interesting that its targeted completion date in 2027, is nearly a century after Mayor Broadbent and the City Council decided to create their own power department.

I'm grateful for the city leaders that helped pioneer (settle) Lehi in 1852 and continued to pioneer (prepare for others to follow) since it was established. Police Department

We have had a lot of success in getting the community to participate with us during previous events and we would encourage everyone to take some time and go through their medicine cabinets and identify those prescriptions that are unused, unwanted, or expired and bring them down to the event on October 29.

For those who cannot make it on October 29 the Police Department has a drop box located in the lobby that is available during business hours for prescription dropoff's.

Please remember we can't take any needles, biohazardous material, or nuclear medicines. Also, please don't bring any personal care products such as sunscreens, shampoo, soaps, or conditioners. Those may be placed in your standard garbage cans.
