Our winter after-school session begins this month and runs through February, and our fall/winter ABC Program will be ending December 14 and 15. Open registration for the winter/spring ABC Program will be open on our website December 5 until classes are full. Parking and Snow Removal

Please be aware that parking on city streets during or for 24 hours following a snow storm is prohibited by Lehi City municipal code. In addition, from November 1 to March 30, parking on a city street is prohibited from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Lehi Streets Division will prioritize snow removal on city streets during and after a storm. On average, the division plows 4,000 lane miles of road per storm. The Streets Division will begin with roads that receive the most traffic and then plow roads in residential neighborhoods.
