### Are You Prepared?

You know it's been a record year for snow when the first two articles on the city webpage are "Flood Information and Resource Page" and "A Prepared Community". In the link for "A Prepared Community," Mayor Johnson shared some information from the USU Emergency Preparedness Team that we can all do as residents to help mitigate any damages.

- Clear debris or snow from your gutters and downspouts to help prevent water from backing up and seeping into your home.
- Know the elevation of your property in relation to plains, streams, and other waterways.
- If the ground is sloped 1 inch per foot near the house, moving snow just 3 to 5 feet away from the house can help reduce the possibility of flooding.
- Keep water out of window wells. Build dams and contour the ground so water will naturally drain away from the house. This can be accomplished using sandbags or adjusting landscaping.
- Move valuable items to a higher level in your home or offsite to protect them from flood damage.
- Be aware of weather conditions and flood warnings in your area. Listen to local news broadcasts and emergency alerts to stay informed.
- Have an evacuation plan and location destination planned if it becomes necessary.
- Keep your car's gas tank full in case you need to evacuate.
- Store food, water, and critical medical supplies.

On the "Flood Information" page Lehi's CERT organization put together a video on the proper filling and placement of sandbags. In talking with members of CERT, if sandbags are filled and placed incorrectly, you can end up causing more damage than if nothing was done. If you feel you need sandbags (which are available at the Power Department: 560 West Glen Carter Drive and the Lehi Cemetery: 1525 North 600 East) please take the time to watch their very informative 5-minute video.

With all the water we've received I wanted to share two other items for your consideration:

1)Irrigation Start Date: Typically, irrigation usage starts on April 15 and ends on October 15. However, due to the abundance of rain and snow this winter, The city is requesting that you wait until May 1 to start using irrigation. I know at my home, especially after the early April snow, we just barely had all the snow melt so there is plenty of moisture in the ground to sustain our lawns w/out watering them.

2)Irrigation Usage: Despite the record snow fall we had does not mean we should abandon our water-wise practices that have saved millions of gallons of water over the past several years. Watering (at most) every other day is more than adequate for a healthy lawn and will allow the city and state to leverage the snow melt to start refilling our reservoirs that have dropped so much over the past several years.


