Wow!

No doubt, Lehi has always been a patriotic place that honors its traditions. This summer let's be grateful for all the wonderful celebrations we enjoy, and let's support all the hardworking folks who make them happen. We may grow and change, but as James said in his next text: "I love that Lehi keeps the traditions the same as best we can." It's so true. We always have and always will.

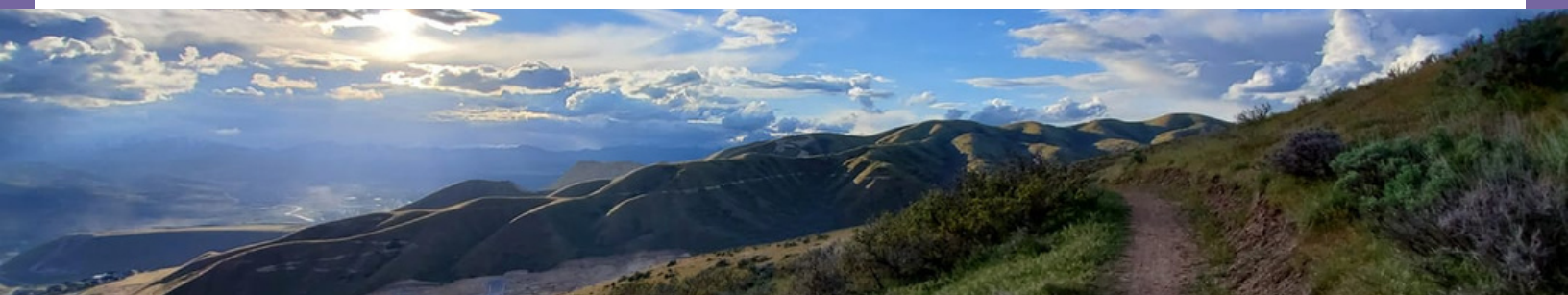
