



Have you heard the news?

Lehi City is deploying a city-wide fiber internet network to all subscribed homes and businesses in the city. When fiber is available, residents will be able to experience:

Fiber that can carry signals nearly at the speed of light and are capable of delivering gigabit speeds and beyond.



Virtually unlimited bandwidth potential so you can perform more online activities and run more connected devices.



An internet connection that is more reliable and more secure than any other type of internet technology.

WHAT WILL CONSTRUCTION LOOK LIKE?

Crews will place the main fiber line along public roads and city rights-of-way, which may include areas surrounding driveway curbs. This involves marking existing underground utilities with flags or temporary paint markings so crews don't unintentionally disturb them and is required by law. If you need to remove flags for some reason (mowing the lawn, etc.) you may do so. Crews will do their best to minimize any impact on city streets and day-to-day traffic during this process.

Once mainline construction is completed in your neighborhood, you can expect crews to leave the area temporarily and return later once they are ready to feed fiber lines directly to homes and businesses. If you choose to have a fiber connection placed at your home, you will be notified before any work takes place on property beyond the city rights-of-way. Great care will be taken to return your yard to its previous condition after work is completed. Remember, there is no cost to have your connection installed during the construction phase.

After a fiber drop has been placed to your house, your selected ISP will work with you to complete an in-home equipment installation.

CHOOSING YOUR PROVIDER

The City's fiber network is considered an "Open Access Network" which means that you will still be able to select an ISP and package of your choice. All the participating providers will be utilizing the same great fiber infrastructure. More details on how to make this selection will be made available to you in the coming weeks. How to Prepare Yourself Now

CONTRACTS

Avoid renewing any long-term contracts with your current ISP. Consider month-to-month.

2

PERMISSION

You may need to speak with your landlord or HOA about permission for installation to your premises.

CONSIDER MAKING THE SWITCH TO STREAMING TV

There are many different TV solutions available with a fiber connection. Streaming services like Netflix or Amazon Prime Video, should all run smoothly with fiber internet speeds because fiber is the most reliable and advanced internet technology available in the world.

If you're used to traditional cable TV services, these streaming solutions will differ slightly and will require a streaming device of some sort.

Additionally, some providers offer streaming services bundled with their internet packages.

GET INFORMED

To build the network, crews will occasionally need access the public right-of-way and public utility easements on private property.

An easement is a defined area of property that is legally designated for specific use, access, and travel by an entity other than the property owner.

INVESTIGATE

*Not all properties have utility easements in the same location. All easement information should be available on the title work and plot plan for each property.

While private property belongs to the owner, property owners/occupants cannot limit access or utilization of the easement for routine maintenance, construction projects, or emergency repair.
