The Value of Elections

Back at the end of May, Chris Stewart, serving in the US House of Representatives, resigned from Congress. As a result of that our traditional election dates for the Primary and the General election were pushed back to allow for a replacement to be chosen this election cycle. Just over a month ago, on September 7th, Jake Anderegg

(serving in the Utah State Senate) announced his resignation. This past Wednesday (October 11th), there was a special session held of delegates in Senate District 22 to elect his replacement for the remainder of his term. As a delegate, I had a front-row seat to the process of not only evaluating the candidates but also having a say in who would replace him. I was impressed that of the 150+ delegates in the district, there were 130 that showed up on a rainy Wednesday evening as early as 5:00 to meet the candidates. With the voting starting at 7:00, the final results (after 6 rounds of voting) were not determined until almost 11:00, when Heidi Balderree was declared the winner.

I share this because I'm grateful we live in a country where we value our elections. We value elections so much that when Chris Stewart stepped down, the Lt. Governor's office moved our election dates to ensure candidates would have adequate time to campaign and, more importantly, voters would have enough time to determine

who is best suited to would have adequate time to campaign and more importantly voters would have enough time to determine who is best suited to represent us in Washington. We value elections so much that when Jake Anderegg stepped down, there was a pre-determined process in place (through the caucus/convention system) to be able to vote on a replacement to fill out his term.

Now onto Lehi. About a month from now (Tuesday, November 21st), we'll be able to go to the polls to make our voice heard as to who will represent us on the City Council for the next 4 years. From a historical perspective, the last time we had an election where the full slate of incumbents wasn't running for re-election was in 2015, when there was one open seat. This year we have two open seats after Katie Koivisto (1 term) and Mike Southwick (3 terms) decided to step down.

First, I want to thank them both for their years of service. It's not an easy thing to put yourself out there in such a public way. I've had the privilege of learning from the perspectives they bring, the way the approach challenging issues, and how the interact with their constituents. Lehi is better because of their service and I'm better as a council person for their service.

It's been exciting to see the new blood that's been willing to throw their hat in the ring to serve our community. While I'm sure we won't get the 80%+ turn out there was from delegates to vote on Jake's replacement I hope as a city you'll join me at the polls to express our will on which of the six remaining candidates will serve us for the next four years.

Puzzle exchange will take place from 10 am - 4 pm on Friday, November 17.


