



FIRE DEPARTMENT OPERATIONS

“Our Family Serving Yours” is the mission of Lehi Fire Department. In this sense, we see the community as a family. They seek stability and safety in their homes, in their business, and in places where they recreate. Our family is the fire department we see each other as more than coworkers, we aspire for greatness for our fellow firefighters. Through our successes on the level of department-wide amelioration, we can best serve the family that is the community of Lehi.

Our accomplishments during 2022 were a culmination of hard work from Lehi Firefighters, fire department command staff, City Administration, and elected officials.

A list of major accomplishments for 2022 include:

- Spring and Fall Northern Utah County Training Alliance recruit camp. First camps to include Fire I &II certification.
- Captain Bronson Smith assisted in updated and formatting the fire department SOP/SOG manual.
- Drone program expanded to include drones and operators at each station.
- Wildland team deployed three times to suppress and mitigate wildland fires in Utah, California, and Idaho.
- Implemented Check It, an inventory control system that incorporates apparatus, narcotics, medical supplies, station inventory, and uniforms.
- Implemented First Watch, this resource is available for all personnel who seek mental health professionals that specifically target public safety personnel.
- First all-female fire camp was initiated. “Camp Courage” targeting females interested in joining the fire service. With help from surrounding agencies and department personnel, the two-day camp was a success.
- Open House for the community was done for fire prevention week. Lehi Fire Department personnel and the citizens of Lehi made this a successful event.
- Westlake ER opened in the Fall of 2022. Lehi Fire Department contracted to transport patients in need of a higher level a care from Westlake ER.
- Completed our annual Sub-For-Santa fundraiser. Tremendous support from our firefighters and community made this another successful event.






RESPONSE DATA 2022

Call for service by month




Interfacility transports by month

New Businesses

With Lehi's extensive collection of office buildings, many Utahns call Lehi home during their 9-5. Lehi has become one of the many coveted locations for business in Utah. As a result, our Fire Prevention team has been working around the clock to keep up with the new and changing businesses in the city. One of the first steps to starting your business in Lehi is a Fire and Life-Safety inspection. Accompanied with a business license application, this gives us the opportunity to verify that your work space is free of fire hazards along with anything else that may prevent safe occupancy of your work space.

Ongoing Inspections

Lehi Fire Department strives to maintain safe working and living environments for all who find themselves within our reach. Our Firefighters dedicate time, in between 911 calls and training for the inevitable, to inspect our local business spaces for fire and life-safety hazards. These inspections are performed on an annual basis. On top of that, our Fire Prevention Division performs annual inspections on all restaurants and Multi-Family Residential spaces. At any time, we are happy to provide our inspection services; just give us a call.


Lehi Fire Department completed a total of 307 business inspections in 2022

TRAINING & CONTINUING EDUCATION

In 2022 the Lehi Fire Department saw rapid growth and development in many areas of the city. Over the course of the year the department hired 8 new full-time firefighters. All of these employees were required to complete an extensive camp to be trained to test for their FF1 and FF2 certifications. The 2 camps consisted of 720 hours of firefighter training and 40 hours of medical training. The department also completed an ADO ariel class certifying 9 of our full-time personnel in the operations of our Ladder Truck. This certification consisted of 40 hours of driver training.

Lehi Fire Department is committed to providing the highest quality of training to our members so they will be prepared to offer the best care and response to the citizens of Lehi. Lehi Fire Department is also committed to staying at the forefront of this ever-changing industry.

WILDLAND

2022

In 2022, the Lehi Fire Department started off our ninth year in the wildland response program. Our program has 15 active members that serve the community of Lehi. The team consists of 3 qualified Engine Bosses, 1 Engine Boss Trainee, and 11 Firefighter Type 2 personnel. The team also is available for deployment to the Western United States for assistance during the summer season when fires overwhelm local agencies.

While 2022 was considered a mild year for our department, we were still able to respond on four separate incidents spending 45 days on wildfires this year. The team responded to one of the first fires in Utah (Jacob City) and then were sent to a fire in Nevada (Wildcat) before returning home. Shortly after, we responded to California to assist in a large complex fire (McKinney) in the Northern part of the state. In the later weeks of summer, our team was called out of state once again to help with multiple fires in Idaho (Sawtell Peak, Wild Horse, Ross Fork). The team will continue to build upon experiences, tactics, and knowledge in the wildfire program to better serve our community when we are called to action.



Special Response Team (SRT)

Lehi Fire Department is part of a Utah County wide response team for urban search and rescue. The team has 14 active members that are trained in the following disciplines: Confined space, trench rescue, rope rescue, heavy extrication, structural collapse, open/swift water rescue, and ice rescue. The team trains bi-monthly with other cities in the county totaling over 400 hours of training a year for the department. This year we began to focus on training all department members to the level of awareness and operations in all disciplines. Currently all Lehi Fire Department are trained on ropes, trench, and ice rescue in the ops/awareness levels. We will continue to work on getting every member of the department trained to awareness and operational level the upcoming year.
